Connected approach: Clackmannanshire Council Wide Approach

Our partnership with Clackmannanshire Council has grown from strength to strength in the past year as we have connected with schools, community groups, and council leads. In doing so, we have been able to support strategic planning, looking at the best ways to increase engagement in

children's human rights and implement improved practices across professional settings. Our engagement has included connecting with the Youth Voice Lead and Chief Education Officer to plan the best approaches to building capacity of all staff to increase UNCRC adoption.

In doing so, we can influence planning at a council-wide level. Two key impacts have been thus far:

1.

The support of the development of strategic planning throughout the council in relation to UNCRC and children's human rights. Supporting the creating a Clackmannanshire Council approach to children's human rights, considering both education teams and wider coverage across council departments.
