BWITTING!




A fun craft which you can do anywhere, any time, all you need is some yarn!

You can use anything you like to make your chain as long as it's long and thin; string, wool, shoe laces...

Make your chain!

Slip the end of your yarn between your thumb and pointer finger. Hold this nice and firmly when you begin. Then loop the yarn around the back of your pointer finger and begin to weave it in and out of your fingers.







When you get to your pinky, loop the yarn behind and wind it over and under each finger until you reach your pointer again. Then do the same but back towards your pinky. You have now completed a row! You should now have two loops on each finger.











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The next step can be a little bit fiddly so if you are having trouble ask a friend or family member to help you. Pull the bottom loop on your first finger up and over the second loop and all the way over your finger. Repeat for each finger. You will then be left with a single loop on each finger. If it feels a little tight give each loop a little wiggle so they don't pinch.







You are now going to start weaving again. Guide the yarn in and out over each finger until you have two loops on each finger once more. Again, pull the bottom loops over the top ones, up over your fingers and repeat!








As you weave you'll start to see your chain growing on the back of your hand. You can keep going for as long as you like but make sure you have a little length of yarn at the end to tie off when you are done.





Nearly there! Very carefully remove the chain from your fingers making sure you keep the loops open. Next take the end of your yarn and carefuly weave it in and out of the empty loops.
