

In all Children's Parliament projects, we use the creative arts - from painting and papier-mache to photography - to explore different topics and ideas. Then, using these works of Art, the Children's Parliament provide children the opportunity to talk with adults about the things that are really important to them.

About Me+Us >

You have been invited to take part in the next Children's Parliament project! Welcome to the Me+Us Investigation Team. Over the next few months we will meet four times to talk about who we are and what it means to be Scottish. This will include positive things like heritage, identity and national history, and negative things, like stereotypes, prejudice and sectarianism. When we meet we will be using photography and collage to document our ideas and discussions. Ultimately, each member of the Investigation Team will produce a life-size self-portrait that expresses who they are and what they believe. These self portraits will then be exhibited locally and nationally to let other people know what it's like to be a child in Scotland.


First Session >

Each session will take place in your school and during the school day. The first Me+Us session will be concentrating on the 'Me' in Me+Us. We will be discussing 'what makes me, Me?' and how am I different from you.

For our first Me+Us session you should prepare to bring 5 small objects and 5 personal photographs. While selecting these 10 I.D. items we would like you to include:

- an item from when you were wee.
- an item that reminds you of a special place.
- one that represents a favourite person.
- an item that you would share with others.
- one that is just for you.
- one that represents your family.

The other four items (whether you choose photographs or objects) are completely up to you, have a think about how you would like to discuss your items during our first session. You might want to use your sketchbook to make some notes or draw out a diagram of what these items mean to you. Remember to bring your pack and items to your first session!



Activity >

You might want to try making an acrostic poem. You could use any word you like. We made one using 'Me+Us', but you could use your name, your school, your town or your favourite Scot's word like 'numpty' or 'cranachan' or 'shlep'! Use your sketchbook and play with some words. Have fun.
