DEAR CLIMATE CHANGEMAKER,

This is a very special mission as it is an invitation to join children across Scotland for day of national action called The Moment. Let us tell you a little bit about why this is such an important day...

In November 2021, Scotland will host an international conference run by the **United Nations**, bringing together countries from all around the world to discuss how they are going to tackle the climate emergency, and how they are going to work together. This is called **COP26**. This is very important as in the past, these discussions have failed to produce real results. It's really important that children's views and ideas are heard as children are already experiencing the impact of climate change and will continue to do so in the future.

What is the United Nations (UN)?

The United Nations is made up of 193 countries. It is often called the UN. It was set up in 1945 after the Second World War as a way of bringing people together and promoting peace.


We know that children also have big ideas and bold Calls to Action for adult decision-makers in Scotland to make sure the big changes needed happen now. On the 29th October 2021 (one week before COP26 begins), Children's Parliament is supporting children across Scotland to meet with their elected representatives to talk about your Calls to Action. This day is called **The Moment.**

Children's stories from this day will be shared with leaders during COP26 to remind them of children's Calls to Action from across Scotland.

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MISSION 3: CHECKLIST

□ INVITE YOUR ELECTED REPRESENTATIVES

First, find your elected representatives and their contact details using the website: **theyworkforyou.com.** With the support of a trusted adult, use our **Invitation to The Moment** template in this guide to write to or email your elected representative about your Calls to Action and setting up a climate surgery on the day of The Moment. This may be an online surgery (using an online call platform) or if safe to do so, it could be in person in your school.

Remember! You can do this by yourself or why not team up with other children in your school or community.

PREPARING FOR THE MOMENT

With the support of your trusted adult, work through the Investigate and Have Your Say activities at **climatechangemakers.scot** to prepare the Calls to Action you would like to discuss. You might like to use the calendar we've created to help you plan out what you want to do in the weeks leading up to The Moment.

☐ THE MOMENT - 29TH OCTOBER 2021

The day has arrived and it's your time to speak to your elected representative about your Call to Action! You might like to use the **Wishing Tree** and **Conversation Suitcase** activities in **Have Your Say Mission 2** to guide your conversation. You might even like to play a game or lead a creative activity together – anything you feel will bring your Calls to Action to life.



CAPTURING THE MOMENT

During your meeting for The Moment, ask your supporting, trusted adult to help you get permission to take pictures and notes of your conversations with the elected representatives. After The Moment, we would love to hear all your stories from the day.

There are three ways to do this:

- Add your climate surgery to The Map! Head over to <u>climatechangemakers.scot</u> to share what you did on our interactive map of action.
- Tag us on social media using the hashtag #TheMoment and @creative_voices (Twitter) @childrensparliament (Instagram)
- You can write a short story or draw a picture about how it went and send it to us. If you share photos, make sure everyone in the photos has given permission for it to be shared. You can email us at info@childrensparliament.org.uk


