HI CLIMATE CHANGEMAKERS,

We hope you're enjoying your investigation so far! We've learned about what climate change is, and what impact it is having in Scotland, and worldwide. Now it's time to think about the solutions and what changes Scotland can make to tackle the global climate emergency.

In Scotland's Climate Assembly, the adult members and Members of Children's Parliament learned about lots of different ideas and solutions that Scotland could take to tackle the climate emergency. They heard from lots of different experts about the types of changes we can make to our diet and lifestyles, the way we travel, how we use our land and sea, and how we work, learn and play. They then discussed what these ideas would mean for children and adults in Scotland, and what challenges there might be to making them happen.

Any plan to tackle the climate emergency must respect both the planet and everyone's human rights – including children! In the Climate Assembly, Members of Children's Parliament talked about how it can be more difficult for some people to make changes to how they eat, live,

travel, work and learn. For example, this might be because of where they live, how much money they have, or simply because they don't have enough information or education about climate change and what to do about it. If we are to make any big changes in Scotland, we must make sure people can get the support they need to make them.

In this mission, you'll exploring the types of changes that we can make in Scotland and what we need to do to make them happen in a fair way. You'll hear from one of the Climate Assembly experts, Professor lain Stewart, before getting creative and imagining your solutions for Scotland.
