MAGICAL MYSTERY BAG

PERFECT ONLINE OR IN PERSON

You won't be needing a crystal ball for this game, but it might help!

This game is all about asking questions to find our what's inside the magical mystery bag!

WHAT YOU NEED:

- A bag (that isn't see-through so no peeking!)
- Things to hide in the bag. Pick things that remind you of your rights. For example, it could be something you play with - like a teddy.

HOW TO PLAY:

One player puts a random object in their bag - don't let anyone see what it is! (If you're playing online, you can just hide the object away from your webcam!)

Other players now ask yes or no questions to guess what's inside the bag.

Here are some example questions!

- Can you eat it?
- Can you write with it?
- Is it to do with the right to health?

The first person that guesses correctly wins a point. They get to go next and hide a mystery item in their bag. Keep going until everyone has had a turn! T

HOW TO MAKE THIS GAME EXTRA HARD:

Put a limit on the number of questions other players are allowed to ask!

See if you can guess the item in only 10 questions!

THE ALPHABET GAME

PERFECT ONLINE OR IN PERSON

This is an extra hard game for teams!

WHAT YOU NEED:

- Pen or pencil
- Paper

HOW TO PLAY:

Split into teams of three or four people. One team chooses a theme that is linked to children's rights.

In teams, think of a word for each letter of the alphabet. For example, if the theme is school: A= Apple, B = Blackboard, C = Canteen, D=Desk etc.

The first team that completes the alphabet wins a point! Choose a different theme and play again!

LET'S CELEBRATE CHILDREN'S RIGHTS WITH STOP THE BUS! PERFECT ONLINE OR IN PERSON

Don't worry, you won't need to stop any REAL buses in this fun game! Instead, it's a race against each other to come up with words & categories!

WHAT YOU NEED:

- Pen or pencil
- Paper





HOW TO PLAY:

Write the following categories as a list:

- 1.A person's name (Article 7 UNCRC)
- 2.Country (Article 7)
- 3. Food item (Article 27)
- 4. Something you'd find at a school (Articles 28-29)
- 5. Something you can play with (Article 31)

One person must think of a random letter & share this letter with everyone.

As quickly as you can, everyone must think of a word which starts with that letter for each category in the list.

The first person who completes all five categories shouts **"STOP THE BUS!"**

Once the bus has been stopped, everyone needs to put their pens down.




Take it in turn to read your answers for each category, one at a time:

- If no one has the same answer to you, you get one point.
- If someone else has the same answer as you for example you both write the country as "Scotland" you both get **zero points** for that category.

Add up the scores to see who's won! Pick a different letter to play again!

HOW TO MAKE THIS GAME EXTRA HARD:

You can make extra rules up if you want! For example, players score double points if their answer starts with the random letter more than once i.e. Tinned Tomatoes (for the right to food!)



PLONK IT ON YOUR HEAD!

PERFECT ONLINE OR IN PERSON

Think of Pictionary...but plonked on your head! This is a super fun game, guaranteed to make everyone laugh!

WHAT YOU NEED:

- Pen
- A notebook (or paper with something to lean on)

HOW TO PLAY:

One person thinks of a right and tells everyone what right they have chosen - e.g. the right to food.

Everyone must put their notebooks on their head and draw an item related to that right. For example, the right to a healthy environment could be a tree!

When everyone has finished drawing, take your notebooks off your head and share your masterpieces!

Take turns to guess what each other has drawn.



When you guess correctly you win a point.

You can keep on playing, taking turns of who chooses a right!
